AREA ONE

Becoming a Peace Mala School is part of the whole School Development Plan approved by staff and the Governing Body. This is shared with the whole school community. **During every academic year, a chosen year group will study and explore Peace Mala by using the kits and educational materials. This encourages Peace Mala continuity in the school curriculum and ensures that every pupil will have encountered the message and vision of Peace Mala before they leave the school.** The school will also share good practice with other schools who are members of the global community of Peace Mala.

Christchurch Primary school is the only Church in Wales school in Swansea. We are a beacon for the community, and we are a welcoming school. We are extremely proud and lucky to have such a diverse school community. We have over 20 different languages spoken, and we have approximately 160 pupils on roll.

We were visited by Estyn in October 2022 and their findings:

"Leaders have created a positive learning environment that promotes inclusion, well-being, and an ethos of mutual respect. Teachers provide many opportunities for pupils to develop an understanding of different cultures, and this is a strength of the school. The relationships between all members of the school community reflect the kind, caring and positive ethos of the school. Nearly all pupils talk confidently about their school and take pride in their multi-cultural and diverse community."

We became a Peace Mala accredited school in 2014, where we collaboratively promote friendship, respect, and peace between people of all cultures, lifestyles, faiths and beliefs. Peace Mala focuses on the Golden Rule: "Treat others as you would wish them to treat you". Its intention is to educate and remind everyone that this rule is recognised by many scholars, teachers and philosophers.





In June 2023, we became an accredited School of Sanctuary (SOS) which further builds on these beliefs and with a focus on being committed to creating a culture of inclusion for refugees and people seeking asylum. We currently have seven pupils who identify as refugees. However, we believe 'refugee' is not to be referred to as a 'label' and all children are treated with love, care and respect.

AREA ONE EVIDENCE

- Activities about our provision on Peace Mala are reported in assemblies and at Governors' Meetings as well as being regularly communicated to parents and the wider community. (PIC 1.1) (PIC 1.3)
- The school has a prominent designated notice board and web pages or newsletter which details Peace Mala activities. (PIC 1.2)
- Peace Mala provision continues to be a focus in the School Development Plan as a 3 yr priority. Throughout the year we attend celebrations/ church services and local Swansea initiative projects which all strongly support the Peace Mala message. As a church school, we fully support and continue to deliver a rich curriculum with the Golden Rule running through our provision, beliefs and values. (PIC 1.4)



AREA THREE

By using Peace Mala in the classroom, the school supports **human rights** and helps **prevent bullying and all forms of prejudice**.

Our curriculum at Christchurch Primary is rich in heritage, history, religion, diversity and encourages our 12 Values to be at the heart of everything we do.

- We took part in the Holocaust Memorial Day (PIC 3.1)
- The AOC devised their own power points on Anti-bullying. We update our Anti-Bullying Policy annually and share with all stakeholders. (PIC 3.2) (3.9)
- We regularly invite the PSCO team into Christchurch and they deliver lessons to all year groups (PIC 3.3)
- In 2023, we worked very closely with the (IRC) International Rescue Committee, and all staff were trained in how to support refugees and trauma informed learners in the classroom. (PIC 3.4)
- We have Playground and Lunchtime 'buddies' and a Buddy bendy/ Buddy Bus Stop sign. This is an area in the yard where children are encouraged to play together.
